## ***From the Pastor's Desk ...***

### ***New Law, More Laws and Grace"***

Starting in January there is a new law that may or may not effect you. Here is the law: ***A person may not operate a motor vehicle on a roadway while using an electronic communication device to compose, send, or read an electronic message".***

I am surprised that the law didn't go further and say a person may not operate a motor vehicle when talking on a cell phone. I have not been in a close accident when someone was texting. I have been in two somewhat close calls when the other person (it just happened that it was a woman driving but please read this whole message before you say I am sexist) was on their cell phone – talking. The first was when I was in a funeral procession and the lady was not paying attention – she did have a green light. The second time, a lady was on her cell phone talking, and not paying attention to the traffic around her and we almost collided. So, I can understand why texting and driving would be bad, but what really scares me is: people talking on cell phones while driving. There should be another law passed. Men are not allowed to talk to their significant other while driving a motorized vehicle. I speak from personal experience once again. It was a Friday night and I am driving south, getting close to downtown Decatur. I was speaking with feeling and the light was yellow. (You should know that I think the timing of yellow lights in Illinois is barbaric. New Jersey has a more civilized timing of yellow lights that gives me the extra time I need to safely make it through an intersection.) My prejudice came out as instinct when I saw yellow, I thought I could make it. I was paying attention to a good conversation with my wife, not the timing of yellow lights. Anyway, I quickly realized my poor judgment in thinking I could make it through the intersection- not even close. As I am going through the intersection I look for a police car – my heart sinks as I spot one on a corner – as the youth of today say – my bad.

I experienced grace because I broke a known law and didn't receive a ticket. If only there was a law against talking to my wife I would have focused on my driving and I would not have run the red light. But I am a flawed driver and it is just a matter of time before I make a mistake. The apostle Paul said the law is not bad (Rom. 7), it is the people that are flawed, thus we need grace. Grace works, I am a more careful driver, being self aware of my proclivity to "make it on the yellow". Fortunately, when I went through the red light, the policeman in the car was talking on his phone or daydreaming or looking for a more obvious violation – I don't know why he didn't pull me over – it was grace. I thank God for grace and the law of "love" that makes us all grace filled people. My hope for us all in 2010 is to live a grace filled life as we seek to love God with all our heart, mind and strength.
